Within "Trarira, die Freiwilligen die sind da! EVS with children in Vienna" volunteers were involved in activities in private child, after school care Vienna. During the period of 10 months, 9 EVS volunteers had the chance to develop their volunteering projects in Vienna, where they had the opportunity to have a working experience abroad while they were living in a foreign country, getting to know a new culture, people and language. Objectives of the project promoted active citizenship as well as solidarity and tolerance.
